Outcomes

OBJECTIVE 1: Engage all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.

- All pupils were taught PE for an average of at least 2 hours per week.
- Bikeability training was offered to all pupils in year 6.

OBJECTIVE 2: Raise the profile of PE and sport across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.

- Sports club after school for all children to attend across the year.
- Badminton coach taught children in years 3, 5 and 6 across the year. Children were targeted who did not attend extra curricular sports activities. All children who participated in interschool tournaments.

OBJECTIVE 3: Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

- All teachers worked with a sport coach for both weekly PE lessons throughout the year. As a result, it was perceived by teaching staff that:
 - 20% of teachers had improved knowledge of **swimming**
 - 80% of teachers had improved knowledge of **dance**
 - 80% of teachers had improved knowledge of **gymnastics**
 - 100% of teachers had improved knowledge of **games**
 - 100% of teachers had improved knowledge of **athletics**
 - 40% of teachers had improved knowledge of **OAA**
 - 20% of teachers had improved knowledge of **using IT in PE**
 - 100% of teachers had improved knowledge of **warm-ups and cool downs**

OBJECTIVE 4: Offer a broader experience of a range of sports and activities to all pupils.

- KS1 multi-sports extra-curricular clubs were established and run free of charge.
- KS2 multi sports extra curricular clubs were established and run free of charge.
- A variety of 13 different sports/activities were offered during extra-curricular time.
- A badminton coach worked with 36 children in years 3, 5 and 6
- 71% of pupils in KS2 attended a minimum of one extra-curricular club over the course of the year.

OBJECTIVE 5: Increase participation in competitive sport.

- Badminton coaches came into school to run sessions, all children who were taught in the sessions participated in tournaments with local schools - 36 children in KS2 (57%).
- Mini-bus hire and staff cover enable children to participate in a variety of inter-school competitions these included football, gym multi-sports,
- The school participated in 17 level 1 and level 2 competitions across the year.
- 100% of pupils KS2 participated in a minimum of 1 level 1 competition with a large majority participating in more.

Swimming

At the end of last academic year the number of children who could do the following are:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over at distance of at least 25 metres – 11/14
- Use a range of strokes effectively – 10/14
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations – 9/14
