<p>See Link 1 below and watch Number blocks Odds and evens</p> <p>At school we watch the episode twice!</p> <p>Discuss with your child what happened in the episode today. Pay attention to the tops of their heads!</p>	<p>Give your child a number of objects, up to 10 (pebbles, beads, pasta, marbles, socks!) and ask them to share them with you, so it is fair. (You need to have the same amount each!)</p> <p>Can all the numbers be shared?</p> <p>Can your child see a connection with the different shaped number blocks? The ones with a 'bump' on their head can't be shared. There is always a spare one.</p>	<p>Draw a line down the middle of a page and write the headings odd and even.</p> <p>Look again at the objects you had yesterday. Share them again.</p> <p>Write the numbers that CAN be shared on the 'even' side and the numbers that CANNOT be shared on the 'odd' side.</p>	<p>You or a grown up should write out all the numbers from 1 to 20.</p> <p>Take two different coloured pens/pencils.</p> <p>Use one colour to circle all the odd numbers and the other colour to circle all the even numbers. What do you notice?</p>	<p>Go for a walk and look at the house numbers you can see.</p> <p>Can you decide if the numbers are odd or even?</p> <p>Do you notice anything about how the houses are numbered and where the odd and even houses are?</p>
<p>With an adult have a look at the 'Land, Sea and Air' powerpoint.</p> <p>Talk about where different dinosaurs live.</p> <p>Can you pronounce the dinosaur names?</p> <p>Have a go at writing them!</p>	<p>With an adult read through the T.Rex song (see link). It is a poem that can be sung to the tune of 'I'm a little teapot'.</p> <p>See if you can play the musical instrument that you made last week, whilst reading/singing the poem. Think about the rhythm.</p> <p>See if you can do a little performance for your family.</p>	<p>Grown ups – please write the words</p> <p>in tin bin pin win</p> <p>for your child to read. Challenge them to write the words themselves – remember to use best handwriting.</p>	<p>Make a card to send to a friend or family member, telling them about the things you have been doing at home.</p> <p>Remember to include a picture or two!</p>	<p>Find out their address and write it on an envelope.</p> <p>If you haven't got an envelope you could always try making one!</p>

Please try and read every day! It doesn't have to be a school book....signs, recipes, magazines, computer game instructions all count!

<p>Find out what a fossil is.</p> <p>You might have to do some research on the internet with a grown up.</p>	<p>Have a go at making some fossils – (see link below)</p> <p>If you don't have any dinosaur toys at home, don't worry, you can use any plastic toy you have to make an imprint.</p>	<p>It's Wednesday again...you know what to do!</p> <p>Go onto YouTube and find a just dance song!</p> <p>Make it different to last week.</p> <p>Get your whole family to join in!</p>	<p>Look on Google Earth with an adult and talk about the world.</p> <p>Have you been to any other country before?</p> <p>Can you find your house?</p>	<p>Snuggle with your adult and read a story!</p> <p>Let me know what stories you are reading!</p>
