Use the power point to read the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff Have you heard the story before? How would you be feeling if you were one of the goats crossing the bridge?	Can you remember what happened first, next, then and last? Write up the story in your neatest handwriting.	Write a letter to the troll explaining why the goats need to go across the bridge.	Write a character description of the troll. Think about what he looks like; what colour is he? How big is he? Etc. Remember to include a picture of him!	What was your favourite fairy tale and why? What did you like best? What was your least favourite fairy tale and why?
Have a go at the Billy Goats Gruff song. It is sung to the tune of 'Twinkle, twinkle little star. Can you play a beat using your percussion instrument?	Imagine the troll won't let the goats cross the bridge so they have to use a raft. Have a go at making a raft to get the goats to the other side. Will it float?	It's Wednesday again...you know what to do! JUST DANCE!	Use some playdough to make the different characters in the story. Think about their different shapes and sizes. Can you make a bridge that they can try and cross!?	Snuggle with your adult and read a story! Let me know what stories you are reading!
