Silver Birch

This week we have been thinking about ourselves and what makes us special. We have also written about what we did in the summer holidays. In Maths we have been doing place value. The Yr 1's have done numbers to 10 and the Yr 2's have done up to 50. We have made a great start – well done!

Chestnut

This week we read and chatted (lots of chatting) about our class book 'The Very Hungry Worry Monster'. We made our own worry monster and posted some of our worries. The monsters can now live and be used at home from today. We dusted off the maths equipment and learnt the value of a digit and made numbers up to 100.
