CLASS NEWS

Nursery

We have been learning all about fish. We have told nursery rhymes, read some stories and have made our own fish and cut them out and coloured them in. We have been singing (outside) '1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive' and '5 little fish went swimming one day'. Have a sing with your child at the weekend and see what they have learnt – this will help their speech and language.

Willow

We have been exploring colours this week. We have been mixing primary colours which was very messy and great fun! We have started our phase one phonics and have been learning our numbers to 10. We read a story about little monkeys too.

Silver Birch

This week we have started our new English book. We have predicted what we think the story will be about and have come up with a list of questions to ask one of the main characters. In Maths we have continued with place value. The Yr 1's have been counting forwards and backwards to 10 and the Yr 2's have been partitioning numbers to 50 and comparing different two digit numbers to 50.

Chestnut

This week we have been diving into our book 'The boy at the back of the class' and asking questions about his previous life in Syria. In Maths we have been representing numbers in all different ways, including lolly sticks and we have been talking about all the important people who are in our local community too!

Maple

We have started learning about solids, liquids and gases in Science...sadly Miss Hughes forgot the ice poles! In Maths we have been partitioning numbers and looking at their place value and in English we have been finding out why Tristan loves the city dump so much.

Oak

We have been working hard on grammar and punctuation in English this week, learning about different types of nouns and how to use commas to add extra information. In Maths we have been comparing, ordering and rounding numbers. We have been looking at the lives of refugees and migrants and finding out about reasons for migration and asylum seeking in Topic.
