This week we continued to look at Jesus' ministry and what we can learn from his example and teaching. In the run up to Easter, it is a time to think about the concept of Salvation.

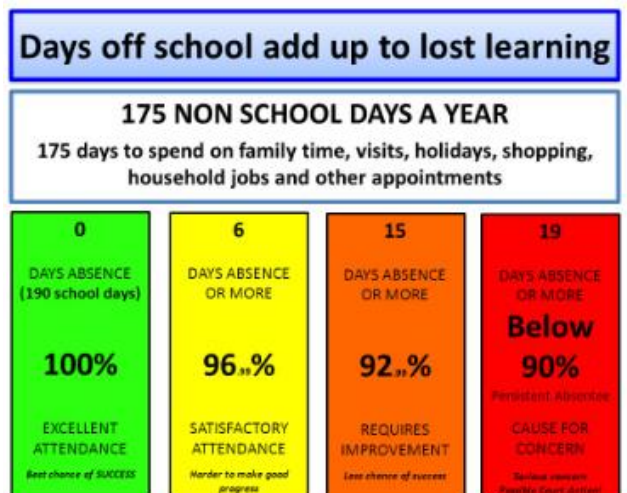

In Maths, we have been dividing using different methods. Year 6 have used long division and Year 5 short division; we have all used mental methods when appropriate. We have also used the rules of BODMAS to answer calculations with different operations. In English, we have been writing using effective dialogue. We discussed the punctuation needed for speech, powerful synonyms for said and the use of adverbs to further clarify the character's emotions. In History, we have learnt about the Mayans; we looked at the main occupations of the Mayans today, the ruins of Chichen Itza and looked at different artefacts as evidence for how the Mayans lived. We investigated reasons for the ancient Maya leaving their jungle settings. In Computing, we continued to design our computer games based on a theme. In RE, we learnt about the refuge and what it means to Buddhists.
